

Davy Crockett Here We Come




You guessed it, the dates for our San Antonio reunion are set for March 18-22, 2007 at the Crockett Hotel. A limited number of

For starters, we'll be enjoying San Antonio at the height of its season. We'll also be there for their 3 day St Paddy's celebration that will be held on March 16 - 18, 2007. The St. Paddy's Day Weekend has much in store for those who would like to celebrate.

Our reunion itinerary is also taking into consideration those of us who enjoy a more leisurely pace by providing ample time to sit back and smell the roses or to explore a bit of San Antonio on your own.

Day 1- Crockett Hotel check in Sunday 3/18/07

- A scrumptious dinner at Rio Rio River Walk Restaurant
- Dinner is topped off with an evening cruise down the San Antonio River along the River Walk

What better way to say hello than at our Margarita get acquainted party.

The Rio Rio Restaurant with its fabulous river view is just a short walk from the Crockett. We will be enjoying our dinner in the main dining area of the restaurant.

Day 2 – Enjoy a bit of Texas at the Rio Cibolo Ranch. Monday 3/19/07

We'll arrive at the Rio Cibolo Ranch at approximately 6:00 PM to enjoy a traditional Western BBQ with non-alcoholic refreshments and a **KEG-of-BEER** to quench the thirst of our hard ridin trail blazers. We'll also enjoy some of that good old fashioned Texas entertainment. Hopefully, we'll get back to the Crockett by 11:00 PM to unwind and get a little rest for tomorrow's rendezvous.

The "Rio Cibolo Ranch" is a working Longhorn cattle Ranch and Pecan Orchard located northeast of downtown San Antonio. The Ranch is situated along the route the Spanish Conquistadors took as they made westward during the sixteenth century. This route was later designated "The Old Spanish Trail" and stretches from Florida to California.

Day 3 – We have a long day planned with visits to the Admiral Nimitz Museum and the Fredericksburg Hill Country with a Professional Tour Guide on each of our buses.

We'll be on our way by 9:00 AM for arrival to the Admiral Nimitz Museum by 10:30. After our Memorial Service and exploration of the museum it will be lunch time. Lunch is on your own in historic Fredericksburg Hill Country. Our tour guide has told me we'll have an

opportunity to take a slight detour and see some LBJ sites.

The national museum of Pacific War is the only institution in the continental United States dedicated exclusively to telling the story of Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz and World War II in the Pacific Theater. Located on a nine-acre site, the complex includes The National Museum of the Pacific War-George Bush Gallery, the Nimitz Hotel museum, the Japanese Garden of Peace, the Pacific Combat Zone, the Plaza of the Presidents, the Surface Warfare Plaza, the Memorial Wall, the Veterans Walk of Honor and the Center for Pacific War Studies. In addition to nearly 45,000 square feet of indoor exhibit space, the museum boasts an impressive display of Allied and Japanese aircraft, tanks, guns and other large artifacts made famous during the Pacific War campaigns.

Day 4 – Banquet Dinner

By this time we thought you might enjoy some free time and just want to chill out and 'smell the roses' as the saying goes. If you still have the energy and haven't yet been to the Missions, etc. it might be a good time for a trolley tour.


Rio Cibolo Ranch Western Roundup BBQ with entertainment.

San Antonio Highlights

San Antonio is the third largest city in Texas with one of the nation's largest military centers. It is home to Fort Sam Houston, Lackland Air Force Base, Randolph Air Force Base, and Brooks City Base. San Antonio was named for the Portuguese Saint, Anthony of Padua, whose feast day it was when a Spanish expedition stopped in the area in 1691. More than 20 million tourists per year come to enjoy the famous River Walk with its fine restaurants, the Alamo, Tejano culture and many other historical and cultural traditions.

The airport is an easy 12 mile shuttle drive to downtown San Antonio.

St. Paddy's Day Celebration is a 3 day St. Paddy's celebration that will be held on March 16 - March 18, 2007. The St. Paddy's Day Weekend has much in store for those who would like to celebrate including, a parade, the annual "Dying the River Green," with 35 pounds of environmentally friendly dye that will turn the San Antonio River into a miniature Emerald Isle for the weekend of St. Patrick's Day. On Friday, there is expected to be more than 15,000 people to take part in the festival along the river walk, which will be followed by the local pub-crawl. I'm betting on Sid all the way. On Sunday, the festivities will reconvene for the "Re-dying of the River," followed by the Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade

that includes a parade of barges to commemorate the Great St. Patrick. Held: River Walk, 602 E. Commerce, San Antonio, TX 78205

The Historic Crockett Hotel is located in the heart of downtown San Antonio, adjacent to The Alamo and across the street from the River Center Mall; gateway to the emerald waters of the famous RiverWalk. Steeped in Texas tradition and history, this landmark and its staff will make your stay in San Antonio a memorable one. The Menger Hotel, its sister hotel is just across the street.

Trolley Tours

San Antonio City Tour Company

Tours are taken on your own and begin daily at 9 AM daily. Tickets may be purchased at the Menger Hotel or Alamo Visitor Center.

The San Antonio City Trolley Tour Co. offers an all day HOP on/off pass for \$23 in air-conditioned trolleys with attractions narrated by the driver . Tours depart from The Alamo Visitor Center next to the Alamo.

Trolley tours begin at 9:30 AM daily and run continually every 30 minutes.

Trolley Tour Destinations

The Alamo - Founded in 1718, where 189 Texans and Tejanos fought against Santa Anna's army in the battle that inspired the cry "Remember the Alamo."

Mission San José - See how the missions formed the foundation of the city and learn about South Texas' unique history and colorful culture. Learn how life was inside the mission walls. Mission San Jose is an active parish. Visitors are welcome to attend Mass on Sundays.

Mission Concepción - Original frescos are still visible within the rooms of the mission. This is the oldest unrestored stone church in our nation today.

Market Square - A taste of old Mexico! Arts, crafts and food in a unique market setting with over 50 specialty shops.

San Fernando Cathedral - Founded in 1738, this is among the oldest Catholic parish churches in the southwest. Main Plaza - the heart of San Antonio dating from 1772. Plaza De Armas - the original site of the Spanish Presidio and home of the Spanish Governor when Texas was under Spanish rule.

La Villita - San Antonio's oldest surviving neighborhood dating from the 1750's is now alive with artists and craftsmen, shops and restaurants.
